



A MESSAGE FROM LAURIE LAWRENCE

Drowning is the greatest cause of accidental death in children under five in Australia. In 1988 Queensland lead the world per capital with drowning in the 0-5 age group. To combat the problem I started the "Kids Alive - Do the five" water safety program. The message is simple,

1. Fence the pool
2. Shut the gate
3. Teach your kids to swim - it's great!
4. Supervise - watch ya mate, and
5. Learn how to resuscitate

In 2000 the "Kids Alive" program went national via the website, community service advertising and a free travelling kids water safety show. Today the Kids Alive show is the biggest touring free show in Australian. As well as touring metropolitan areas, to date the show has visited 545 country towns, 44 remote communities and played to more than 225,000 students Australia wide.

- The Queensland Injury Surveillance Unit estimates that for every 1 child that drowns, 14 are taken to emergency rooms and 4 of those are admitted to hospital as a result of immersion.

Why do children drown in backyard pools?

- Inadequate fencing or no fencing
- Lack of gate security
- Lack of efficient water skills
- Inadequate supervision
- Lack of resuscitation skills
